Matter

二、各档次的给分范围和要求:

第四档(很好):A) 9—10分; B) 16—20分

完全完成了试题规定的要求,覆盖所有内容要点,符合英语表达习惯,应用了较多的语法结构和词汇,没有语法和词汇错误,具备较强的语言运用能力,完全达到了预期的写作目的。

第三档(好):A) 6—8分; B) 11—15分

完成了试题规定的要求,应用的语法结构和词汇能满足题目的要求,符合英语表达习惯,基本没有语法和词汇错误,达到了预期的写作目的。

第二档(一般):A) 3—5分; B) 6—10分

未恰当完成试题规定的要求,漏掉内容要点,未描述清楚主要内容,写了一些无关内容,有语法和词汇错误,影响了对写作内容的理解,信息未能清楚地传达给读者。

第一档(差):A) 1—2分; B) 1—5分

未完成试题规定的要求,明显遗漏主要内容,写了一些无关内容,语法结构单调,词汇项目有限,有较多语法和词汇错误,影响对写作内容的理解,信息未能传达给读者。

0分

未能传达给读者任何信息:没有内容或内容太少,无法评判,写的内容均与所要求内容无关或所写内容无法看清。

Passage A

Listen to the following material and choose the best answer to each question. The material will be read twice.

W: In today's programme, David Green has come along to tell us something about the new Waterside Shopping Centre. Good morning, David.

M: Good morning. Well, it has taken three years to build Waterside and it opened three weeks ago, two months later than planned. Firstly, how did I get there? The coach that goes there leaves early and returns very late, so I drove. Parking is no problem. You can also get there by train, but the station is 15 minutes from Waterside by bus, and the buses are really crowded, so you sometimes have a long wait. About the facilities at the shopping centre: they are arranged on three levels. There are 15 different shoe shops on levels one and two. You can withdraw money at the ATM on the second level. On the third level, there are several restaurants, as well as a cinema with seven screens. Before you go back to your car or the bus, you could go and see the lake. Take a walk or have a go at fishing, sailing or wind surfing if you have time. Or you can rest your tired feet and watch the birds and ducks, but you are asked not to feed them. Oh, well, although I had a good day, I would like to complain about one thing. The service in the shops was good and I had an excellent lunch in a café. No, the silly thing was that everywhere was quite clean, people were dropping their sweet papers and empty drink cans on the floor because there wasn't anywhere else to throw them.

Passage B
