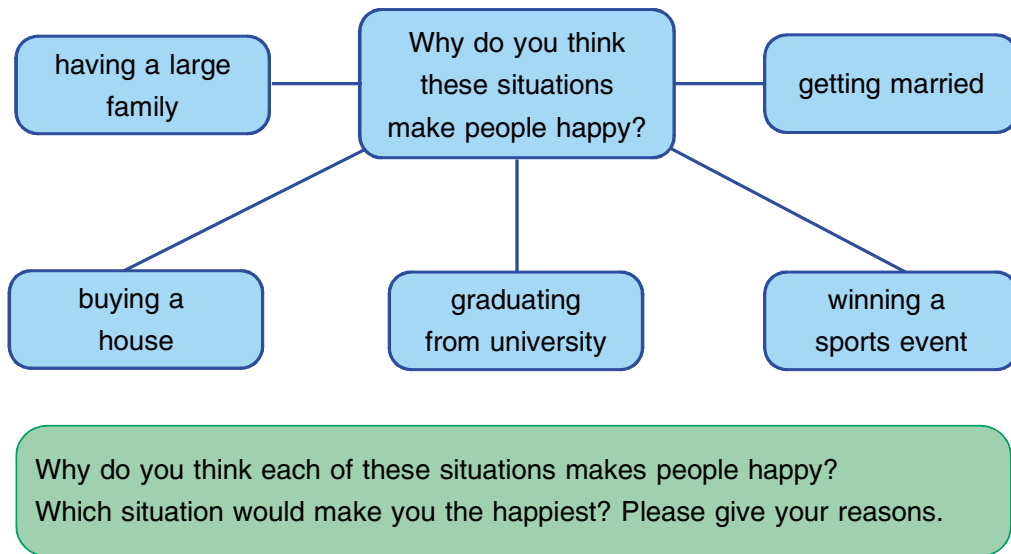



He was the winner of England's two most distinguished literary awards, the Whitbread Prize and the Children's Book Award, and all of his works are perennial (连续多年的) bestsellers. He did all his writing in a garden shed (小屋) with six yellow pencils by his side. 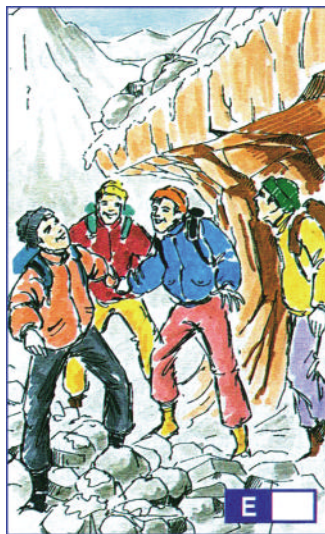

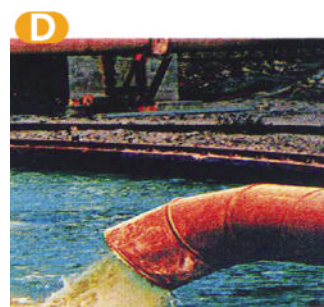

Here are some things you should consider before you start.

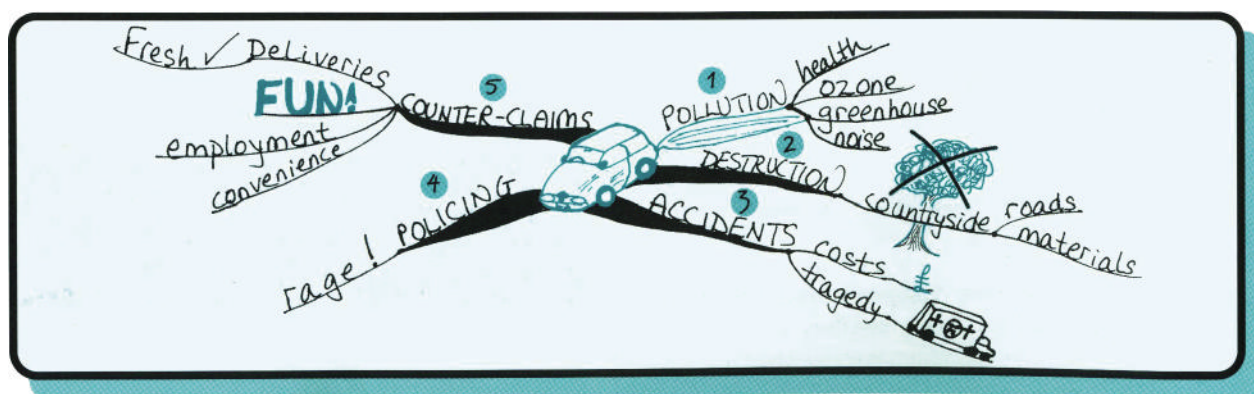
Purpose

You have to bear in mind the exact purpose of the piece of writing, who it is aimed at. Remember, you may want to entertain, instruct, persuade or argue.

Planning and structure

Planning is the backbone of any piece of good writing. And if you plan properly, the structure will automatically follow on. The best way to plan is using a Mind Map. If you don't know how to do this yet. Take the example of the following question: "The world would be a better place without cars." Write an essay arguing EITHER for OR against this statement.

The Mind Map below shows how the writer has brainstormed and organized his arguments. The numbers show the order in which he had decided to deal with each branch of the Mind Map.



Beginnings and endings

You'll find that the beginning comes more easily once you've planned properly, and once you know what your conclusion will be. Think of it like this: it's easier to begin a journey if you know your route and destination. It may help to draft the beginning and ending at the same time. Your ending could echo your beginning, giving the reader a sense of completion.

The beginning should capture the reader's attention, give an idea of what is to come, and arouse curiosity. Here are some beginnings for the above essay.

It's a grey Monday morning on the Walworth Road. Nazia pushes her toddler in the buggy. She's walking her 7-year-old son to a school half a mile from her home. At this hour of the day, her route is lined by a smoking, grumbling crocodile of cars, buses and lorries, all moving at a snail's pace, all pushing out a cocktail of chemical fumes into the air she and her children breathe.

Isn't it wonderful to bowl along the open road, fresh air pouring in the window, serenaded by the sound system, while whitewashed cottages and rose gardens race past? But wait a minute...

The last ten years have seen road traffic grow by 40 per cent, and thousands more miles of roadway built. Road transport produces 4.5 million tonnes of deadly carbon monoxide a year. Since 1979 diesel smoke has doubled. How does all this affect us?

How you end depends on your exact purpose. You might want to frighten people into action, or give them hope. By and large, you should aim to sum up your arguments and draw them to a short, punchy conclusion. You could echo the beginning, or leave the reader with something extra to think about. Here's a possible ending to match the third beginning above:

Is the convenience of the car really worth the cost in human life and limb, stress, lung disease, and environmental destruction? Many people think not. But unless society as a whole decides this, by the year 2030 we will be face with the nightmare of one and a half times as many cars on the road as we have now. How will we come then?

Making your writing interesting

To write really interesting and persuasive non-fiction, you have to back your arguments with an appeal to the reader's imagination and emotion. Here's another version of the first beginning.

It's Monday morning on the Walworth Road. Nazia pushes a buggy. She's walking her 7-year-old to a school half a mile from her home. At this hour of the day, there is a great deal of slow-moving traffic, all of it creating pollution.

Link words

Link words and phrases go between parts of a sentence, or at the beginning of a sentence, to smooth the flow of ideas and prepare the reader for what's coming next. They are particularly useful in writing argument. Here are the most important:
